Class Description: In this class, students will develop a love of writing by being exposed to a variety of writing types and activities to strengthen their writing abilities. Students will learn about the 6+1 traits of writing (ideas, word choice, fluency, voice, organization, conventions, and presentation) and use these to bolster their writing to the next level. We will be doing a variety of creative writings so that students can write what they love so they can love what they write. Students will also learn important types of writings for different audiences. Skills will be taught through interactive activities and mini lessons so that students can apply these through their own writings.

Objectives:

- Understand the writing process and the different steps involved
- Brainstorm ideas for writing through prewriting activities
- Develop ideas fully for an intended audience
- Choose words that give readers a detailed picture in their minds
- Show readers what is happening in writing rather than tell them
- Organize a writing in a clear manner
- Use correct grammar throughout a writing piece
- Develop a voice in writing that varies based on the type of writing
- Write in different ways- persuasive, informative, creative, etc.

Types of Writings:

- Expository (information)
- Description
- Personal Narratives
- Business Letter
- Friendly Letter
- Problem/Solution
- Creative Storytelling
- Persuasive

Cost:
