1 Elective Credit

Course Description:

A survey of various worldviews based on the *Understanding the Times* curriculum from Summit Ministries. The course focuses on comparing the Christian worldview with the other five major competing worldviews of our day: Islam, Secular Humanism, Marxism, New Age, and Postmodernism.

Course Benefit:

Your view of God determines your view of the world. *Understanding the Times* is a systematic way to understand the ideas that rule our world. Students will learn how to identify and counter these opposing worldviews.

Course Cost:

- \$170 due on the first day of class in January

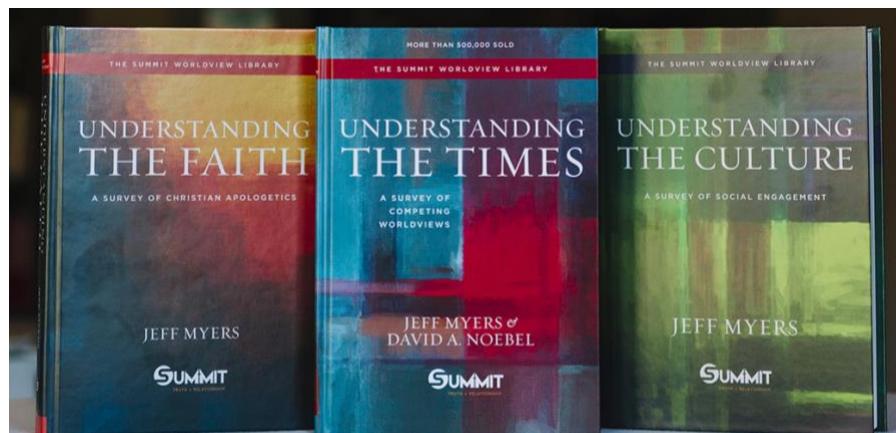
Course Tutor:
